He went on to further his education at a combination of Mechanical Tech Schools earning several certificate levels in Automotive Mechanics.

He was a United States Postal worker, mechanic, musician and driver throughout his life. He later retired as a trainer from a local school bus company.

Harold H. Curry could be easily described as an ambitious leader full of wisdom who always shared ideas of success. He built a lifestyle that entertained the sounds of live music and old school albums. He professed his life to Christ at a young age and was a God fearing man. He attended services every Sunday at Friendly Temple Missionary Baptist Church in St. Louis, Missouri. He donated ample time at local shelters by lending a listening ear and sharing positive advice.
